School Responsibilities

Grant Elementary School will:

Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

- Grant, in collaboration with the Eureka School District, provides professional development and training opportunities to ensure that teachers and staff are trained in best pedagogical practices.
- Ongoing staff training in Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) which is a school-wide student behavior management system that was originally implemented during the 2012-2013 school year. We continue to provide ongoing training in our PBIS and Staff Meetings.
- Ongoing teacher training around the District adopted curriculum - Fountas and Pinnell Classroom and Everyday Math. Ongoing staff training in the areas of Trauma Informed Practices, Restorative Practices and Community-Building activities.
- Grant has an early release collaboration day each Monday where teachers and staff meet to collaborate together and professionally develop in the areas of effective instruction and student achievement.
- Grant provides Reading Intervention, Math Intervention and Designated English-Language to support students.

Hold Parent/Teacher Conferences at the end of the 1st and 2nd Trimesters.

Provide parents with Report Cards (approximately one per trimester)
